Re: <u>DELAWARE REPORTING BEYOND 5TH REPORT</u> <u>REMINDER</u>

As previously announced through Bureau circulars, Delaware has adopted the collection of claim data beyond the 5th report. The transition to this extended reporting began in January 1996 with policies effective May 1989. These policies with claims open at 5th report or reopened after 5th report required a 6th report in 1996 and a 7th report in 1997. These same policy effective dates will become subject to 8th reports in 1998. Similarly, policies effective May 1, 1990 through April 30, 1991 with claims open at 5th report or reopened after 5th report are now subject to the reporting of the 7th report. The Bureau's Overdue Unit Listing will continue to notify members on a monthly basis as to which unit reports have not been filed including these 6th, 7th and 8th reports. Refer to the chart below which illustrates the transition timetable.

Individual Case Reports (ICRs) are still required for all deaths, permanent totals and claims exceeding \$100,000 for policies effective <u>prior</u> to January 1, 1996. The transition to the Advisory Statistical Work Group (ASWG) reporting of ICRs for deaths and permanent totals only began with the filing of January 1, 1996 policy claim data.
