BUREAU CIRCULAR NO. 718

To All Members of the Bureau:

Re: MANUAL REVISIONS CODE 924, WHOLESALE STORE, N.O.C., AND CODE 927, DRUGSTORE, RETAIL EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 1999

The Bureau has filed and the Insurance Commissioner has approved Manual revisions to Sections 2 and 5 to become effective as of 12:01 a.m., July 1, 1999 with respect to new and renewal business only. These revisions result from a Bureau study undertaken to review parameters for assignment to Code 927 and establish a definitive classification assignment procedure for employers operating as mail order pharmacies.

The enabling Manual revisions to Sections 2 and 5 are shown below with deleted wording bracketed and new wording underlined:

SECTION 2

927 [DRUGSTORE]PHARMACY, Retail - all employees, including office.

SECTION 5

Rulings and Interpretations

WHOLESALE/RETAIL MAIL ORDER HOUSE - DEFINITIONS

Wholesale

For the purposes previously listed.

Wholesale <u>store</u> operations generally include the maintenance of warehouse inventories; delivery and the promoting of sales through utilization of an outside sales force and/or by telephone or fax. Many but not all wholesalers may also perform the physical assembling, sorting and grading of their goods; the breaking of bulk quantities and repackaging into smaller lots. A wholesaler may <u>also</u> have a sales counter <u>where a walk-in customer's order may be</u> <u>written up and payment for merchandise made</u>. The counter clerk may transmit the order to the warehouse or the customer may take the order to the warehouse for fulfillment.

Mail Order House

[Risks]An enterprise principally (more than 50 percent of the gross receipts) engaged in selling by mail order shall be assigned to the <u>appropriate wholesale store</u> classification [that would be used for a wholesale store dealing in]for the commodities handled <u>except for mail order pharmacies filling individual patient drug prescriptions which shall be assigned to Code 927</u>. Mail order sales by a [risk engaged in] manufactur[ing]er or incidental to a retail store <u>business</u> shall be classified in accordance with the class <u>or classes</u> appropriate to the business [at the location]of the employer.

Retail

For purposes of classifying stores[,] the term "Retail" shall be construed to mean the selling of displayed merchandise in store type premises where [clerks]floor and/or counter <u>salespersons</u> assist customers or on a self-service basis to the general public for personal or household consumption or use. Warehouse operations incident[al] to the retail [operations of the employer]store enterprise shall be assigned to the <u>enterprise's appropriate</u> retail <u>store</u> classification.

The appropriate retail store class shall also be [used]assigned when the insured, while technically a wholesaler, operates primarily in a retail manner. The customers will [tend to] generally be commercial or professional users. "Retail manner" means such insured will have a large merchandise display area, customers may [browse and select desired items from the displays and]walk up and down the display aisles, inspect the merchandise being offered for sale, place their selections into either a shopping basket or shopping cart and will make payment for their selections at a customer checkout lane. [t]The [risk's]employer's single largest group(s) of employees [shall be]are floor or counter salespersons [waiting on walk-in]assisting customers or performing customer checkout.

(There is no sales tax on merchandise sold in Delaware, but in the event such is enacted the act of collecting a sales tax on merchandise sold will not be [considered] a [controlling] factor in defining a retail store and will have no bearing upon determining the <u>business'</u> classification assignment.)
